What the Committee did

- Volunteered to be part of a community PACE committee
- Developed a community survey that was relevant to Lincoln City
- Surveyed 77 of the 79 residences in Lincoln City, door-to-door between September 28th and October 5th, 2009

What the Lincoln City Community Action Committee worked on -

- Improving the quality of life in Lincoln City through grass-roots community involvement and energy

The Community Survey

What we asked

- General questions about the community
- Questions about living in Lincoln City
- Questions about the lifestyle of the residents of Lincoln City
- Questions about the people that live in Lincoln City – age, number of people in a household, income, etc.

Top Identified Issues

Survey issues that the community would like addressed

- Paving the road to the cemetery
- Installing do-not-litter signs and “Church” signs
- Installing speed bumps
- Cleaning up litter and dumped garbage
- Street lights
- Improving drainage along roads

What's been accomplished?

- Speed bumps are ordered and installed on SE 144th Terrace initially
- “Church Zone” and “Do Not Litter” signs are up
- Trash clean up has begun
- Other improvements are planned

Accomplishments

- Trash Clean-Up
 - Dumpsters delivered – three so far
 - Bradford County workers mowed roadsides and picked up roadside trash
 - “Community Effort Day” was on Saturday morning, May 22nd. The Lincoln City Community Action Committee, along with some volunteers, picked up trash along every road in Lincoln City

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

- As a result of all the work that's been done by the Lincoln City Community Action Committee, the Health Department applied for funding to make Lincoln City a NEIGHBORHOOD EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PROGRAM community.

The purpose of the Neighborhood Emergency Preparedness Program is

- To help a community be prepared in an emergency
- To enable a community to be self-sufficient until help is available
- To give a community the resources so that residents can help and take care of each other until help arrives or things return to normal

- Funding supported the following programs
 - CPR Training
 - First Aid Training
 - Disaster Preparedness Training
 - A “Disaster Kit” that will be provided to every household in Lincoln City

Future Plans

The Lincoln City Community Action Committee is planning:

- Another “Community Effort Day” in October
- Continuing bulky trash clean up with regular dumpsters
- Moving forward on other issues that will improve the lives of Lincoln City residents
