


NEPP in Orange County City of Orlando

The “Tornado Damage Assessment and Point of Destruction” drill was held at a City of Orlando Community Center. This was a joint NEPP Community drill (2 NEPP communities: Metro Hispanic CERT and Holden Heights Community) conducted on January 28, 2012.


Two scenarios involved in the drill were:

- (1) Establish a point of distribution (POD)
- (2) Report damage assessment to command utilizing radio communications.

Overall: The scenario was based on a fictional tornado damaging certain homes on pre-defined streets in the community. The respective areas were identified on a map of the community. Two teams were identified; with one team conducting the damage assessment of the stricken area and the other team establishing and running a POD. Once each team completed their [respective] assignment, the teams switched and conducted the other assignment to ensure all participants were involved in all aspects of the drill experience.
