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Please review the enclosed *Bureau of Immunization (BOI) Assessments Ranking Report for 2011-2012*. This report is a compilation of county-specific results of the following previously published BOI assessments:

- *Kindergarten and Seventh Grade Immunization Status Report 2011-2012*
- *Vaccine Accountability January 1, 2011 – December 31, 2011 (Cumulative)*,
- *Assessment of County Health Department Immunization Coverage Levels (2012) (aka CHD Annual Assessment)*
- *Survey of Immunization Levels in Two-Year-Old Children (2011)*

Each assessment listed has a double underline distinguishing which counties reached the state goal for that individual assessment. All 67 county health departments surpassed the "Unaccounted For" goal, as shown in the *Vaccine Accountability* report. Sixty-six counties met the goal for the *Immunization Status Report, Seventh Grade*. Five counties, compared to one county last year, met the goal for the *Survey of Immunization Levels in Two-Year-Old Children*.
