- SUBJECT: Assessment of County Health Department Immunization Coverage Levels in Two-Year-Old Children (2015)

#### INFORMATION ONLY

In January 2015, the Immunization Section completed an annual immunization assessment of all one- and two-year-old children whose parents rely on a Florida county health department (CHD) as their child's immunization home. The Florida State Health Online Tracking System was the sole source of data collection for this assessment, which consists of all active records of children from 12 to 23 months of age and children from 24 to 35 months of age, respectively, with a common review date of January 1, 2015.

The results are based on recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, which recommends the following:

- All children from 24 to 35 months of age complete the 4:3:1:3:3:1 (4 DTaP/DTP/DT, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 3 Hib, 3 Hep B, and 1 Varicella) immunization series by 24 months of age.
- All children from 12 to 23 months of age complete the 3:2:2:2 (3 DTaP/DTP/DT, 2 Polio, 2 Hib, and 2 Hep B) immunization series by 12 months of age.

The national coverage goal for two-year-old children is 90 percent; however, the state coverage goal is 95 percent. All CHDs should keep in mind that the Department's performance measure for the Governor's Balanced Score Card (BSC) is 95 percent. In addition, the national and state coverage goal for one-year old children is 90 percent.

Enclosure 1 provides statewide and CHD-specific coverage data for the two-year-old children assessed. Of these, 92 percent completed the 4:3:1:3:3:1 series by 24 months of age, a three percent improvement from last year. Of the 67 CHDs, 31, or 46 percent, achieved or exceeded the state coverage goal. Of those, ten attained 100 percent. Ninety-one percent completed the 4:3:1:3:3:1:4 (4:3:1:3:3:1 plus four doses of pneumococcal conjugate) immunization series by 24 months of age.

Enclosure 2 provides statewide and CHD-specific coverage data for the one-year-old children assessed. Of these, 84 percent completed the 3:2:2:2 series by 12 months of age, which is a three percent improvement from last year. Of the 67 CHDs, 17, or 25 percent, achieved or exceeded the state and national coverage goal, three of these attaining 100 percent.

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Enclosures 3 and 4 provide a break-down of CHDs by immunization site. Enclosure 5 provides statewide and CHD-specific coverage rates for the 4:3:1:3:3:1 series for two-year-old children assessed over the past five years. The highest rate was in 2012 with 95 percent—the lowest was in 2014 with 89 percent.

Enclosure 6 provides the **number** of two-year-old children assessed over the past five years. These data show a 57 percent decrease in the number of children with a CHD immunization home from 2011 to 2015. Despite this decrease, 54 percent of CHDs did not meet the 95 percent state coverage goal.

Children who miss the fourth dose of DTaP/DTP/DT negatively impact statewide efforts to achieve the 95 percent state coverage goal. To consistently achieve the coverage goals of our one- and two-year-old children, it is important for CHDs to focus their efforts and resources in the following key areas:

- Utilize reminder recall tools to identify active clients due for immunization.
- Utilize the immunization internal operating policies, technical assistance guidelines, and the *Immunization Guidelines for Florida Schools, Childcare Facilities and Family Daycare Homes*.
- Assess the impact of recommended interventions on service delivery.
- Utilize clinical and WIC visits to assess immunization status, encourage vaccination compliance and provide appropriate immunizations.

The Immunization Section field staff will continue to provide technical assistance to help identify your specific areas to improve and to recommend strategies to increase your immunization rates. The Quality Improvement (QI)/Clinical team is actively working on a statewide QI project to improve two-year old immunizations rates and to develop additional recommendations to increase coverage rates. The QI/Clinical team continues to perform scheduled monitoring site visits and is available to provide ongoing technical assistance and guidance to CHD staff as needed. These collaborative efforts will help us reach our state coverage goal for Florida's two-year-old children and enable us to achieve our common goal of providing Florida's infant population with the best protection possible against vaccine-preventable diseases.
