SUBJECT:

Kindergarten and Seventh Grade Immunization Status Report 2016–2017

Each October, all public and private schools with a kindergarten or seventh-grade are required to submit reports indicating the immunization status of their kindergarten and seventh-grade students. This information is compiled and sent to the Immunization Section for tabulation. Enclosures 1 through 4 are summaries of kindergarten data and enclosures 5 through 8 are summaries of seventh grade data. This year's report reflects immunization coverage for 224,467 kindergarten students and 228,815 seventh-grade students.

#### Purpose:

- To decrease the occurrence of vaccine-preventable diseases by increasing immunization coverage levels among school-age children
- To emphasize the importance of immunizations to our community partners, including public, private, and parochial schools
- To ensure the enforcement of Florida Administrative Code Chapter 64D-3.046 and section 1003.22, Florida Statutes, regarding immunization. Florida law states students may not attend school without proper immunization documentation. Schools permitting students without proper documentation are in violation of the state law. Instead, schools should exclude those students from school until proper documentation is provided. (Exceptions: Schools may issue temporary [transfer] exemptions for up to 30 days for [1] students transferring into a new county; [2] a homeless child; [3] juvenile justice system entry; and [4] children of military families as defined in section 1000.36, Florida Statutes.)
- To identify those counties needing assistance in raising immunization coverage levels in kindergarten and seventh grade to Florida's goal of 95 percent. The national goal for kindergarten and seventh grade is 95 percent and 90 percent, respectively.

#### Results—Kindergarten:

Statewide, 94.1 percent of kindergarten students were reported as receiving all immunizations (listed below) required for school entry/attendance:

- Four or five doses of diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (DTaP) vaccine
- Three, four or five doses of polio vaccine

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- Two doses of measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine
- Three doses of hepatitis B vaccine
- Two doses of varicella vaccine

Of Florida's 67 counties, only 38, or 56.7 percent, achieved or exceeded the 95 percent state goal of kindergarten students receiving all required immunizations upon school entry/attendance. Statewide, 293 students, or 0.1 percent, had inadequate immunizations or inadequate documentation of immunizations. Students with exemption from immunization accounted for 5.7 percent of the total kindergarten population as reflected below:

- 6,986 temporary medical exemptions, or 3.1 percent
- 841 permanent medical exemptions, or 0.4 percent
- 4,725 religious exemptions, or 2.1 percent
- 307 30-day exemptions, or 0.1 percent

#### Results—Seventh Grade:

Statewide, 95.9 percent of seventh-grade students were reported as receiving all immunizations required for school entry/attendance, including but not limited to:

- Completion of the hepatitis B series.
- Two doses of measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine.
- Two doses of varicella vaccine.
- One dose of tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) vaccine.

Sixty-three of 67 counties, or 94.0 percent, achieved or exceeded the 95 percent state goal of seventh-grade students receiving all required immunizations. Statewide, 615 students, or 0.3 percent, had inadequate immunizations or inadequate documentation of immunizations. Students with exemptions from immunization accounted for 3.9 percent of the total seventh-grade population as reflected below:

- 4,602 temporary medical exemptions, or 2.0 percent
- 823 permanent medical exemptions, or 0.4 percent
- 3,238 religious exemptions, or 1.4 percent
- 135 30-day exemptions, or 0.1 percent

The seventh-grade temporary medical exemptions is 0.4 percent higher than last year but has remained **lower than 4.4 percent assessed seven years ago** (2009–2010).

It is important to remember 30-day exemptions should only be issued to students with qualifying exceptions as noted in *Purpose*, page one, bullet 3. Inadequately immunized non-transfer students should be permitted school entry or attendance **only after presenting proper documentation of vaccination**. It is the school's responsibility to follow up with students with temporary medical and 30-day exemptions, ensuring students complete the immunization series.

Collaboration between the school's health nurse (who may or may not be a CHD employee) and the school's administrative staff is crucial. Using a reminder system to recall students in need of immunizations has been shown to increase vaccination coverage rates.

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Please continue to partner with local schools, school districts, managed care organizations, and private health care providers to promote the *Recommended Immunization Schedule for Children and Adolescents Aged 18 Years or Younger—United States, 2017*, located at www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/downloads/child/0-18yrs-child-combined-schedule.pdf.

We encourage you to contact your local area field staff representative to assist with identifying areas of need and developing strategies for increasing your county's school immunization rates. Collaborative efforts will help us reach our state school coverage goal and enable us to achieve our common goal of providing the best protection possible against vaccine-preventable diseases.

The Immunization Section thanks its community partners, especially the Florida Department of Education, school districts, and local schools for their efforts regarding the compulsory school immunization law, thereby assisting in the decrease of vaccine-preventable diseases.
