TALLAHASSEE—The Association of Public Health Laboratories (APHL) recently awarded Dr. Andrew Cannons with the 2015 APHL Emerging Leader Award and Dr. Philip Amuso with the 2015 APHL Lifetime Achievement Award at the annual meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana. The awards given at this meeting mark outstanding achievements in laboratory science, creative approaches to solving today's public health challenges and exemplary support of laboratories serving the public's health.

He has provided many years of service to APHL through membership committees including the Workforce Development Committee.
