Tallahassee, Fla.—The Florida Department of Health reminds all Florida residents and visitors to plan ahead for a safe and fun New Year's celebration. Take the time to talk about safety measures with your loved ones before the fun begins. Almost 9,000 people were killed in crashes involving a drunk driver in Florida from 2003-2012.

"We all want to ring in the New Year with fun and celebration," said State Surgeon General and Secretary of Health Dr. John Armstrong. "I urge everyone to plan for safe travel – let's start 2016 without the tragedy of deaths from drunk driving."

A few tips to ring in the New Year with safety in mind:

Don't Drink and Drive

- Before you head out for the night, plan your transportation to ensure no one drives impaired;
- If you are a designated driver, do not drink. One drink is one too many; and
- If you see an impaired driver on the road, don't hesitate to contact local law enforcement or dial *FHP (*347). This call could save a life.

Use Fireworks Responsibly

- Know and follow all county and city fireworks laws for your area;
- Always have a water source (full bucket of water or hose) and a fire extinguisher close at hand;
- Do not allow children to play with or light fireworks; and
- If a firework does not light or fire, let it sit for at least 20 minutes then carefully place it in a bucket of water.
