She isn’t sure which funding source pays for which kids. 60 – 65 pregnant women/year, 60 – 65 newborns.</p>	<p>\$829,678</p>
<p>BOND COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER INC Damon McMillan- 850-576-4073 Ext 220</p>	<p>Kelvin Williams – HIV+ pregnant women are referred to a specialist for prenatal care. HIV-exposed babies are seen by pediatricians in the community since they have Kidcare. HIV+ kids go to the CMS clinic for care.</p>	<p>\$609,074</p>
<p>UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA, Tampa Alisha Marion – 813-259-8800</p>	<p>Alisha Marion – Clinic in Tampa and St. Pete once a month to cover 15 counties. ~ 50 HIV-exposed babies/year. If these babies don’t come to their clinic, they don’t go anywhere else because pediatricians don’t want to treat them/complete the testing.</p>	<p>\$1,461,802</p>
