

# Hepatitis A Surveillance



January 1, 2018–April 10, 2021



Since 2018, 5,053 hepatitis A cases were reported.


In 2016, hepatitis A outbreaks started to increase across the U.S. Florida hepatitis A cases began to increase in 2017 with more than a 500% increase in 2019.

Counties that reported hepatitis A cases in the past two weeks are **outlined in black** in the map below. Since 2018, 98% of cases have likely been acquired in Florida.



The graph below represents hepatitis A cases by month from 2018 to present.


**In April 2021, 8 cases have been reported so far.**

**From March 28, 2021 to April 10, 2021, 12 hepatitis A cases were reported.**




# Hepatitis A Vaccination Surveillance

January 1, 2019–April 10, 2021




Since the public health emergency declaration on August 1, 2019, county health departments (CHDs) have administered 100,433 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine and non-CHDs have administered 142,282 first doses. A total of 400,846 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine were given since 2019.



\*Case counts before the public health emergency declaration are light red, while case counts after are red.

From March 28, 2021 to April 10, 2021, 994 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine have been administered with CHDs administering 173 (15%) of those first doses.



From March 28, 2021 to April 10, 2021, 116 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine were administered by both CHDs and non-CHDs.
