


# Hepatitis A Surveillance

January 1, 2018–June 19, 2021




**Since 2018, 5,098 hepatitis A cases were reported.**

In 2016, hepatitis A outbreaks started to increase across the U.S. Florida hepatitis A cases began to increase in 2017 with more than a 500% increase in 2019.



The graph below represents hepatitis A cases by month from 2018 to present.

**In June 2021, 4 cases have been reported so far.**



\*Case counts before the public health emergency declaration on August 1, 2019 are light red, while case counts after are red.

The graph below represents hepatitis A cases by week for the past eight weeks.

**From June 6, 2021 to June 19, 2021, 4 hepatitis A cases were reported.**




# Hepatitis A Vaccination Surveillance

January 1, 2019–June 19, 2021




Since the public health emergency declaration on August 1, 2019, county health departments (CHDs) have administered 101,801 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine and non-CHDs have administered 147,534 first doses. A total of 407,423 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine were given since 2019.



\*Case counts before the public health emergency declaration are light red, while case counts after are red.

From June 6, 2021 to June 19, 2021, 1,525 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine have been administered with CHDs administering 429 (22%) of those first doses.



From June 6, 2021 to June 19, 2021, 294 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine were administered by both CHDs and non-CHDs.
