- 20 the diploma shall be submitted. An applicant from a foreign country who does not have a high school diploma or
- 21 graduate equivalency diploma shall submit equivalent documentation from a credentialling agency.
- 22 (3) An applicant who does not have proof of a high school diploma or graduate equivalency diploma shall submit
 23 one of the following:
- 24 (a) An official translation of the foreign diploma or transcript indicating completion of a high school or graduate
 25 equivalency diploma, or;
- 26 (b) A college, university or technical school diploma or transcript noting the basis of admission was a high school or
