



## FL Food and Nutrition Resource Programs



**Adult Care Food Program (ACFP)**- Supports the provision of nutritious meals and/or snacks served to community-based adults attending adult day care centers. The nutritious meals support and may improve their nutritional status, enabling them to prolong living in their own community. elderaffairs.state.fl.us/doea/acfp.php



**Child Care Food Program (CCFP)** - The CCFP and two related programs, the Afterschool Meals Program and the Homeless Children Nutrition Program provide nutritious meals and snacks to children through public-private partnerships with organizations committed to caring for children.

**Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)** - Distributes monthly food packages and nutritional information to elderly persons, 60 years of age or older, who are eligible based on income and reside in a qualifying county.

**Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP)** - A free nutrition education program offered through Cooperative Extension that focuses on limited-resource families, with an emphasis on parents and other adult caregivers who have primary responsibility for feeding young children.

**Fresh Access Bucks** - is a USDA funded statewide nutrition incentive program that increases the purchasing power of SNAP recipients to buy fresh fruits and vegetables at farmers markets, produce stands, CSAs, mobile markets, and community grocery outlets.

**School Meals** - National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, After School Snack Program and Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (NSLP, SBP, ASSP, FFVP) - Provides children and teenagers breakfast, lunch and snacks that meet federal nutrition standards in public schools. www.fdacs.gov/Food-Nutrition/Nutrition-Programs/National-School-Lunch-Program



**Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP)** - Supports good nutrition by providing low-income elders living in select counties in Florida with coupons that can be redeemed for locally grown, fresh, fruits and vegetables from participating farmers at local farmers' markets. elderaffairs.state.fl.us/doea/farmers market.php



**Senior Nutrition Program** - Nutrition program services offer more than a just a home-delivered meal or a meal at a congregate meal site. Skilled nutritionists and other professionals in the Aging Network also provide nutrition education, counseling, and risk screening. **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – Education (SNAP-Ed)** - Provides approaches to improve nutrition through direct education, multi-level interventions, community and public health approaches. UF/ IFAS Extension and the Florida Department of Health provide SNAP-Ed to different ages and locations.



**Summer BreakSpot Program** – Provides nutritious meals at no cost to children 18 and under while school is out for the summer.
