

Mass Casualty Incident (MCI) Equipment Supplies List - Purchasing Requirements

Florida Department of Health Tiered Purchasing Requirement

1. The Provider must meet the required minimum quantities before being reimbursed for any other item listed in the Mass Casualty Incident (MCI) Equipment & Supplies List - Exhibit 2 (hereafter referred to as the List). Required minimum items are found on the "Minimum Requirements" tab of the List, and on each applicable equipment category tab.
2. After the Provider has satisfied the required minimum's in #1, then any existing burns and/or trauma cache of equipment purchased from a previous HPP contract must be maintained. This only applies to trauma centers and designated non-trauma centers identified by the Florida Office of Trauma as providing the following services during a Bomb, Burn, or Blast MCI: trauma centers must have available a cache of equipment and supplies to care for up to 20 burn patients for 1-3 days; non-trauma centers must be able to provide surge capacity for 13 trauma and/or burn patients for up to 5 days.
3. After the requirements in #1 and #2 have been satisfied, then preventative maintenance for items purchased in previous HPP contracts are required to be completed to ensure continued operation of the equipment. Preventative maintenance purchases must be labeled with the appropriate pay item number of the item from the List that is being maintained, and include "PM" after the pay item number.
4. Once the requirements in #1-3 have been met (whenever applicable), then the Provider may order any other item from the entire List based on needs identified per their HVA, risk assessment or other identified organizational review process.
5. If the Provider identifies a need to purchase equipment not found in this list, it must follow the requirements as outlined in the current variance process (Exhibit 3.)

Additional Equipment Expectations, Guidelines and Requirements

1. Funding is intended to support equipment for a **disaster** patient surge, including the Emergency Department, Inpatient areas and hospital campus based alternative care sites.
2. Equipment purchased is intended to be readily accessible on-site or initiated within 30 minutes of a no-notice disaster event.
3. Hospitals can choose to use contract funds to maintain a cache of supplies that are inventoried, rotated and maintained, or can choose to **increase** par levels of appropriate supplies per specified amounts beyond seasonal surge levels. Funds are NOT to be used to only bring par levels up to seasonal surge levels.
4. Hospitals must maintain equipment & supplies in a climate controlled environment with a minimum of an annual inventory.
5. Florida Department of Health Contract Managers may conduct announced and/or unannounced programmatic monitoring visits to verify available inventory.
6. Hospitals are encouraged to focus on purchasing equipment to meet the minimum expected standards within the priority areas (listed in order) of: Communications, PPE, Detection and Decontamination and MCI General equipment. Optional equipment can be purchased within categories after minimum required supplies have been obtained and are maintained.

7. Hospitals must meet specifications as outlined in the EMS Communication Plan for radios.
8. The List must be used in conjunction with the requirements, guidelines, and assumptions as outlined in the MCI Guiding Principles 2011-2012 (newly updated and referenced as Exhibit 4).
9. The minimum standard may not reflect the optimal amount of equipment needed for an individual hospital. Hospitals may elect to purchase equipment that exceeds the minimum standard.
10. Procurement of optional equipment or other equipment related to PPE or other categories that is not a part of the List may be made upon formal written approval by the Department. An Amendment to this Contract will be required BEFORE the item(s) can be ordered. The hospital must contact their Contract Manager for additional information. Requests for variances must be received by the Department no later than 60 days prior to the end of the contract period and follow the Variance Process.

11. Only licensed Trauma Centers may purchase from the tab titled "ICU", and only State-designated Advanced Capacity Hospital Laboratories may purchase from the tab titled "Lab".
