Updates / Briefing	<p>-Andy Rucks /UAB: SE Regional Pediatric Disaster Surge Network</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Southeastern Regional Pediatric Disaster Surge Network is a voluntary agreement among health care and emergency responders for the purpose of providing pediatric care mutual aid at the time of an emergency or disaster. The planning and development of the Network is proceeding through three general phases--information sharing, mutual goal setting and collective action, and long-term formal linkages. In Phase 1, critical planning tasks to be undertaken in the development of the Network were identified. The Network is finalizing Phase 2, where Network partners have developed a draft operational handbook that serves as the basis for a formal memorandum of understanding. The MOU is routing in FL DOH. The handbook has an asset typing component which could be addressed by the FL-CPCoalition. The last

	<p>phase for the Network, Phase 3, involves exercises and evaluations that will further identify and work out logistical and operational details identified in the Network handbook. The Network has not met all summer due to the academic schedule, but will re-convene in the fall 2012.</p> <p>-Debby Russo/DCF: Director, Child Care Regulation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Working with the Save the Children organization on updating the Rule which addresses the SAVE Report Card. Language has been incorporated and draft Rule Revision is currently over at the Governor's Office of Fiscal Accountability and Regulatory Reform (OFAR) for input. Once it is reviewed by OFAR and recommendations incorporated, it can be advertised and go through the balance of the rule promulgation process. Debby hopes that this can occur sometime around August/Sept. Rule revision will not be complete prior to the upcoming SAVE analysis/print for the 2012-2013 publication year and therefore, FL will still not achieve 100% in fall printing. The criteria will be achieved in early 2013 in the following year and will be incorporated into the 2013-14 Save The Children Report Card.
