for Fiscal Year 2003-2004

INFORMATION ONLY

The attached Bureau of Immunization assessment results have been ranked according to performance by county and are presented for your review. Individual analyses for kindergarten and seventh grade status, vaccine accountability, and county health department immunization status of two-year-old children have previously been sent to you. The survey of two-year-old children reflects immunization levels statewide and by 17 selected counties: Brevard, Broward, Collier, Miami-Dade, Duval, Escambia, Hillsborough, Lee, Leon, Manatee, Orange, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Seminole, and Volusia. The county health departments that achieved a high percentage in immunization levels and vaccine accountability are to be commended.

Please note the line drawn through the rankings on the attached reports. Those counties above the line have reached the state goal for that assessment, while those listed below the line have not yet reached the established goal. I hope you will find this a convenient tool for use in evaluating your immunization activities.
