


Logging in



To Log In as a Law Enforcement User, click the menu item titled "log in"









Changing Your Password



In order to change your password, you must supply your existing password.

Below this field, you must supply your new desired password, twice.

Because this system contains
Protected Health Information,
you must supply a 'strong'
password that is no shorter
than 8 characters, and contain a
combination of lower and
uppercase letters, one number,
and at least one special
character, such as an
exclamation point.

Searching For a Person



Clicking "Patient Search" will navigate you to the Search tool.


To perform a Search, you must supply the First and Last Names of the person you wish to search for, and also their Date of Birth.

Click Search For Patient when you have supplied this information.

Since the Registry deals in Protected Health Information, it does not allow 'wildcard' searches. You must supply all three items – there will be no searches for "Partial Matches".



The Search Results



For Law Enforcement Users, the Patient Results page will show you whether or not the person you searched for is authorized to possess Low-THC Cannabis.

If the Registry does not contain a Patient or Legal Rep with the information you supplied, it will tell you that the name/dob you searched for is not in the Registry, and is not authorized to possess.



If the person was found, you'll be shown two blocks of information – the top part of the page is if we found a **Patient** matching the name/dob you supplied

Below this, you will either see that the Patient is or is not Authorized to Possess,

Below that, we also show you if this person is the Legal Representative for any Patient, and what they may or may not be authorized to possess.
