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# Introduction

This is the annual review report for the 2018-2021 Union County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). The activities and collaborative efforts of the Florida Department of Health in Union County and community partners will be reflected within the report. This document will serve as a progress review of the strategies that were developed and the activities that have been implemented. While the CHIP is a community-driven and collectively owned health improvement plan, the Florida Department of Health in Union County is charged with providing administrative support, tracking and collecting data, and preparing the annual review report.

# Overview of CHIP and Annual Review Meeting

In October of 2017, the Department of Health in Union County convened the CHIP Planning Team. The Planning Team consisted of members from WellFlorida Council, Union County Health Advisory Group (our community partners), and the Florida Department of Health in Union County. The Planning Team facilitated the CHIP process by using the National Association of City and County Health Officials' Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnership (MAPP) strategic planning model. Subject matter experts from a diverse group of partner organizations conducted the four assessments outlined in the MAPP process. Individually, the assessment yielded in-depth analyses of factors and forces that impact population health. Taken together, the assessment findings contribute to a comprehensive view of health and quality of life in Union County.

The Planning Team after a review of the community health assessment and data, public surveys, and face to face meetings with stakeholders, arrived at the final strategic area issues, which are: Healthy Lifestyles and Behavior, Maternal and Child Health, and Public Safety.

## **Summary of CHIP Annual Review Meeting**

During the CHIP review process, members reviewed and discussed the current goals and objectives. These discussions included current measures and activities that satisfy these objectives. All objectives were reviewed and/or updated based on need.

# 2019 Progress and 2020 Revisions

## **Strategic Issue Area #1: Healthy Lifestyle & Behavior**

The Healthy Lifestyle and Behaviors priority health issue focuses on reducing obesity and chronic disease in children and adults by promoting healthy lifestyle choices and reducing illness, disability, and death related to tobacco and other substance use.

### **Goal 1: Reduce obesity and chronic disease in children and adults to enhance quality of life by promoting healthy lifestyle choices.**

*Objective 1.1.1 Increase the percent of Union adults who are at a healthy weight from 19.8% in 2013 to 20.08% by December 31, 2020.*

Unintentional injuries are a leading cause of morbidity and mortality among adults and children in the United States. This issue area focuses on improving deaths from unintentional injuries.

*Objective 3.1.1:* Decrease the unintentional injury age-adjusted death rate in Union from 59.8 deaths per 100,000 in 2013-2015 to 58.8 deaths per 100,000 by December 31, 2020.

## **Progress in 2019**

Progress was made in many areas in 2019:

In objective 1.1.1 Increase the percent of Union Adults who are at a healthy weight classes on nutrition were provided and were successful. Two classes were targeted for completion until COVID-19 prevented the second class from being completed.

Our Heart Health Plus newsletter has been completed monthly and is distributed by email to all participants and partners for distribution to their clients.

An internal campaign has been completed for staff to assist in healthy weight activities and will continue monthly. The results among staff have been amazing with many staff reducing weight between 5-10% and making great improvement in aerobic activities.

Our progress in Heart Health Plus program was expanding the program from 2 to 6 churches participating in the program.

Objective 1.1.2 was started in 2019 and achieved a good reception within the school district and was moving forward until COVID-19 distributed the school year.

Objective 1.1.3 decreasing the age adjusted death rate for diabetes. Diabetes education was provided with community participation until disrupted by COVID-19. 2 out of 3 groups were completed. We increased participation in health screenings and health fairs to 6 falling slightly short of our goal of 8 due to COVID-19

Objective 1.2.1 deals with our progress in reduction of tobacco use in teens. All targets are on target with modest increases in all areas of tobacco cessation and modest increases in the recruitment of new members of UC Tobacco Free Partnership members. This is contributed to since the population of Union County is small, and recruitment of new members is difficult.

Reporting of tobacco screening have increased but again this is difficult since most are repeat patients and not new patients. Staff is doing a better/good job in capturing these numbers. Union County is a former tobacco growing county and the use of tobacco is part of the local culture combines with the fact there is a lot of poverty in the county and this tends to increase tobacco use. Results are encouraging that there has been an increase in cessation classes in Union County. The tobacco program appears to have an impact on future generations by starting education at a younger age.

Objective 2.1.1 Our progress in the reduction of infant mortality rate is due to increasing safe sleep presentations and working to increase the number of mothers who initiate breastfeeding. These efforts are being led by Healthy Start staff, WIC, and our Community Health Programs team.

Objective 2.1.2 Decreasing the birth rate in teen girls between the age of 15-19 had been successful in the fact that we have seen an increase in use of the Long Acting Reproductive Contraceptive (LARC) from 15.9% to 35.7%.

Objective 3.1.1 Decrease the unintentional injury age-adjusted death rate in Union County. We have undertaken a multi-faceted approach to this problem by providing education and articles on water safety awareness in an effort to prevent accidental drownings, we have provided information and education on car seat safety to prevent car seat deaths and injuries, and we have increased the number of certified car seat technicians from 2 to 4 and have been able to conduct car seat safety checks in Union County. Another initiative has been to distribute bicycle helmets that are properly fitted to bike riders and preventing head injuries.

### **How Targets Were Monitored**

Targets were monitored using several different methods which include supervisors tasking their staff to track the objectives that were assigned to them. After these data were collected the information was given to the PM Champion who enters the information into the performance tracking tool. The performance tracking tool provides information as to which objectives are on track, not on track, complete, not complete or decision required.

The performance tracking tool is presented at the Bradford-Union PMC meeting on a quarterly basis and the results provide a tool for senior management to monitor the findings to either continue with what is being done to meet the objectives or to evaluate a more effective and efficient method to ensure that objectives are on target. This monitoring method allows for a successful outcome.

**No revisions to the CHIP were completed this year because we are starting the process of completing a new Community Health Assessment (CHA) that will be complete by November 2020, and a new CHIP will be started in November and completed by March 2021.**

These efforts will allow us to realize the vision of a healthier Union County.
