	5.1.E Infant	Changes made to the State Plan under Objectives:
	Mortality	 Increase the percentage of EMS agencies conducting programs to reduce infant mortality from 18.5% to 30% by December 2019. Infant mortality is the death of an infant before his or her first birthday. The infant mortality rate is the number of infant deaths for every 1,000 live births. In addition to giving us key information about maternal and infant health, infant mortality is an important marker of the overall health of society. In 2016, the infant mortality rate in the United States was 5.9 deaths per 1,000 live births. (See Mortality in the United States, 2016) Florida – 6.1 deaths per 1,000 The leading cause of deaths in US: Reduce injury – study shows the death of an infant is before his or her first birthday Birth defects, pre-term births, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS), pregnancy complications and drownings Niki Shimko has agreed to coordinate the committee's plan to address this objective. She will be formulating questions addressing this for the 2018 EMS survey for consideration by the committee.

	 Dr. Hendry also reviewed the website set up for the PEDReady program on the EMLRC site. She will be reviewing the site to determine if it should be moved to the University of Florida site. Everyone is encouraged to go to the website and look at it and review it. Dr. Hendry reviewed survey results from ED's equipment challenges, and prescribing, administering and calculating pediatric medication doses. She also discussed educational needs within pediatric units in hospitals and EMS agencies. Lastly, she discussed challenges to transport children to hospital stats. Drownings	Dr. Abo spoke briefly about pediatric drownings, prevention and statistics. Pediatric drownings are a top reason for pediatric death in Florida.
