Catherine Woodstock Striley, PhD, MSW, ACSW, MPE received the Master of Social Work in 1989 and the Doctorate of Philosophy in Social Work from the Brown School at Washington University in St. Louis in 2002 where she was a National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH) predoctoral fellow. The National Institute on Drug Addiction (R03) funded her dissertation research. She completed the Master of Science in Epidemiology from the Washington University School of Medicine in 2004 and completed a three-year postdoctoral fellowship in Epidemiology and Biostatistics funded by NIH in the Department of Psychiatry in 2005. She was a faculty member in that department from 2005 to June of 2011. She has been a co-investigator on many community-engaged NIH-funded studies conducted by Dr. Linda Cottler among community members, out-of-treatment drug users and women in the criminal justice system.

With regards to research in drug use disorder epidemiology, Dr. Striley is Co-Director of HealthStreet, a Community Health Worker (CHW) powered research site. Dr. Striley has been

very involved in training in ethical research conduct and accountability. She was funded by the Office of Research Integrity to plan and co-direct the First Biannual Responsible Conduct of Research Education Instruction and Training conference at Washington University and was funded by the ORI to run a regional conference on Mentoring for the Responsible Conduct of Research. She currently teaches Population Health in Medicine, Psychiatric Epidemiology, and Research Ethics for Population Health and mentors PhD and MPH students as well as Fogarty Fellows. She is the program director for the Master of Science in Epidemiology and the Certificate in Psychiatric Epidemiology programs.
