**SURVEILLANCE DATA: 2014** 

#### FLORIDA VIOLENCE AND INJURY PREVENTION

Accidental injuries are the **leading cause of death for Florida residents ages 1–44 and the fifth leading cause of death overall**.



In 2014, 9,128 Florida residents died from accidental injuries. There were another 110,656 hospitalizations for non-fatal injuries.

### POISONING PREVENTION TIPS: USE THE LAYERS OF PROTECTION

**KEEP** all prescription medications, over-the-counter medicines, vitamins and herbals in a safe place.

**KEEP** medicines and chemical products in their original bottles or containers.

**ALWAYS** read the label.

**DO NOT** mix household products together.



#### AT HOME:

Remove tripping hazards like loose, unanchored rugs.

Install smoke detectors and learn how to use a fire extinguisher.

You Can Prevent Accidental Injuries

Wear protective gear for recreation.

Store medicines and chemicals in a safe place.

#### AT WORK:

Wear proper footwear.



Use protective eyeware and safety equipment.



#### IN THE CAR:

Obey all traffic laws.

Always use seatbelts and put children in safety seats.

Don't text and drive.



Adults 85+ have the highest rate of fatal and non-fatal hospitalizations due to accidental injuries.
