FINAL ORDER

THIS MATTER came before the Board of Nursing (Board) pursuant to Section 120.565,

Florida Statutes and Rule 28-105, Florida Administrative Code, at a duly-noticed public meeting

held on December 8, 2022, in Jacksonville, Florida, for the purpose of considering the Petition

for Declaratory Statement (attached as Exhibit A), filed by Iliana M. Portela (Petitioner).

Petitioner was present. The Board was represented by Deborah Bartholow Loucks, Senior

Assistant Attorney General.

The Petition was filed with the Department of Health on August 4, 2022. Petitioner seeks

the Board's opinion as to whether it is within the scope of Petitioner's practice as a registered

nurse to perform visually-guided sclerotherapy and administer the FDA approved sclerosants of

Sotradecol and Asclera under physicians' orders and supervision.

Having considered the Petition, relevant statutes and rules, arguments submitted by

counsel for Petitioner and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, the Board makes the

following findings and conclusions:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Petition was duly filed and noticed in the Florida Administrative Register;

Volume 48 Number 185 published on September 22, 2022.

2. The Petition is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

3. Petitioner, Iliana M. Portela, is a Registered Nurse licensed to practice nursing in

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the State of Florida, having been issued license number RN 1705632.

- 4. Petitioner is a specially trained Sclerotherapy nurse with 15 years of experience in sclerotherapy.
- 5. Petitioner seeks clarification of whether it is in the scope of her practice to provide low risk treatments in the form of sclerosant medications, in a diluted form, given intravenously to treat patients' small surface veins that are easily visible under physicians' orders and supervision.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 6. The Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to section 120.565, and Chapter 464, Florida Statutes.
- 7. The petition filed in this matter is in substantial compliance with the provisions of Section 120.565, Florida Statutes and Rule 28-105, Florida Administrative Code.
- 8. Section 464.003(20), Florida Statutes, defines the "practice of professional nursing", with subparagraph (b) of this definition stating that "the administration of medications and treatments as prescribed or authorized by a duly licensed practitioner authorized by the laws of this state to prescribe such medications and treatments."
- 9. The Board found that under the specific facts of the petition, it is within the scope of Petitioner's specific and particular education, training, and experience and that she is performing the sclerotherapy and administering the medication under the direction of a duly licensed physician, that the answer to her request would be "yes".

Petition for Declaratory Statement before the Florida Board of Nursing

The statutory provisions, rules, or orders on which the declaratory statement is sought:

1. Section 464.003(20)(a)(b)(c).

"Practice of professional nursing" means the performance of those acts requiring substantial specialized knowledge, judgment, and nursing skill based upon applied principles of psychological, biological, physical, and social sciences which shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) The observation, assessment, nursing diagnosis, planning, intervention, and evaluation of care; health teaching and counseling of the ill, injured, or infirm; and the promotion of wellness, maintenance of health, and prevention of illness of others.
- (b) The administration of medications and treatments as prescribed or authorized by a duly licensed practitioner authorized by the laws of this state to prescribe such medications and treatments.
- (c) The supervision and teaching of other personnel in the theory and performance of any of the acts described in this subsection.

A professional nurse is responsible and accountable for making decisions that are based upon the Individual's educational preparation and experience in nursing

A description of how the statutes, rules, or orders substantially affect the petitioner in the petitioner's particular set of circumstances:

As a registered nurse in the state of Florida, I, Iliana Portela, RN, respectfully petition the State of Florida Board of Nursing for a declaratory statement in regards to if it is within the scope of practice of a specially trained RN to perform visually-guided sclerotherapy and administer the FDA approved sclerosants of Sotradecol and Asclera under physicians orders and supervision.

I am a specially trained Sclerotherapy nurse living in the state of Florida with 15 years of experience specializing in Sclerotherapy. RNs, like myself, can be trained to provide low risk treatments in the form of sclerosant medications, in a diluted form, given intravenously to treat patient's small surface veins that are easily visible.

Due to these restrictions, I cannot find work in my own state in the specialty that I have dedicated an enormous amount of my life to. This restriction is unduly warranted and causes an unnecessary burden for myself and my family.

On the Florida Department of State website there is an instance of a Declaratory Statement for Michelle D. McEvoy (ID 16036639) in which the following was determined by the Board of Nursing:

- "The Board's Order, filed on May 7, 2015, finds that under the specific facts of the petition, the performance of visually-guided sclerotherapy on small and medium sized veins on the surface of a patient's skin under the supervision of a physician is within the scope of practice of an appropriately trained registered nurse."
