


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Executive Summary



In accordance with subsection 766.1115(8), Florida Statutes, the Volunteer Health Care Provider Program Annual Report summarizes the contributions achieved by the program. During Fiscal Year 2024–25, a total of 10,506 licensed health care professionals and 2,450 eligibility and referral specialists volunteered in the program. These volunteers provided medical, dental, eligibility, and referral services at 214 locations across 50 Florida counties. The clinics and organizations reported they provided 403,823 medical services and 73,038 dental services totaling 476,861 health care services to eligible individuals. In addition, they reported that the program's value of health-related goods and services provided to Florida's citizens totaled more than \$300 million. Since the Volunteer Health Care Provider Program's inception in 1992, the Florida Department of Health has documented more than \$5.8 billion in donated goods and services.

Overview

Created by the 1992 Access to Health Care Act, the Volunteer Health Care Provider Program improves access to health care for uninsured and underserved low-income residents. To encourage practitioners to volunteer, the state ensures that sovereign immunity protects them from lawsuits when providing free medical and dental services to underserved populations.³ These professionals volunteer their services primarily in community and faith-based medical clinics that serve uninsured and underserved individuals. The program also trains non-licensed volunteers to determine program eligibility and refer individuals to providers for primary or specialty care. All data presented within this report is for Fiscal Year 2024–25.

To be eligible for medical and dental services through the program, individuals must meet one of two financial criteria:

- ✓ They do not have health insurance that covers the treatment being sought and have a gross family income that is less than 300% (FY 2024–25) of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- ✓ They meet Medicaid-eligibility under Florida law and meet the program's income eligibility criteria (less than 300% FPL). Medicaid clients are eligible to receive services through a free clinic when there is no Medicaid provider available in the area.

About the Program

The program is administered by a supervisor in the Department of Health (Department), State Health Office and by nine regional coordinators across the state. In FY 2024–25, expenditures to administer the program totaled \$579,539. Regional coordinators prepare and manage Department contracts with volunteer health care professionals that include sovereign immunity provisions. County health officers, on behalf of the Department, sign program contracts with licensed health care professionals who volunteer to provide services.

Regional coordinators ensure compliance with sovereign immunity requirements, conduct onsite quality assurance monitoring of patient's medical records, and train non-licensed volunteers in eligibility determination and referral procedures.

Detailed information regarding participating clinics and organizations, services provided, and the value of services are contained in Appendices A through C.

Appendix A summarizes the number of participating clinics and organizations providing services and the total contributions by county.

Appendix B summarizes the number of reported volunteers and health care service counts and the value of contributions by individual clinics for each county.

Appendix C lists the clinics that closed during FY 2024–25. These clinics will not appear in the next annual report.

In addition, subsection 766.1115 (7), Florida Statutes, requires that the program's annual report include a list of claims filed against the program as compiled by the Florida Department of Financial Services, Division of Risk Management. Appendix D documents that no claims have been filed against the program in the preceding 12 months. As previously reported, no claims have been reported since March 2012.


Section 1: Community and Faith-Based Clinics and Organizations

Licensed health care professionals participating in the program volunteer their services at clinics and medical organizations serving uninsured and underserved individuals. During FY 2024–25, health care professionals provided services in 198 community and faith-based clinics.

Since FY 2019–20, the program has increased the number of counties with participating clinics and organizations from 44 to 48. As shown in Exhibit 1.1, of these 48 counties, 37 counties had one to four participating clinics and organizations; five had five to nine participants; five had 11 to 15 participants and Miami-Dade County had 24 participants.

For FY 2024-25, 19 counties had no clinics or medical mobile dental units participating in the program. Most clinics have agreed to provide health care services to patients from these neighboring counties. However, transportation presents a barrier for patients in counties with no participating clinics. To overcome this barrier, some clinics provide health care services to residents by mobile medical units.


The Department's goal is to increase the number of counties with the program. To achieve this goal, in conjunction with participating medical and dental clinics, the Department has worked on outreach to garner interest and future participation in the program.



Dental Services

Dental care is an important service provided through this program. In fact, 74 of the 198 participating clinics also offer dental services. These clinics reported providing 72,129 dental services. In addition, the Florida Baptist Convention Mobile Dental Unit (MDU) is a faith-based organization providing free dental services to patients. For its MDU, Florida Baptist Convention reported 16 dental service visits in 16 counties where they provided 909 dental services. Exhibit 1.2 shows counties with Florida Baptist Convention MDU visits.


The combined total of dental services from clinic providers and MDU was 73,038.



Section 2: Licensed Health Care Professionals and Other Volunteers

During FY 24–25, 10,506 participating licensed health care professionals provided 476,861 health care services to eligible individuals. However, as shown in Exhibit 2.1, the number of licensed health care professionals providing volunteer services has decreased by 21.1% (N=2,810) since FY 2019–20.

Licensed Health Care Professionals FY 2019–20 through FY 2024–25





In addition to the health care professionals who support the program, a total of 2,450 eligibility and referral specialists volunteered to screen clients for eligibility determination and refer patients for primary and specialty care during FY 2024–25.

Section 3: Value of Donated Goods and Services

The value of health care services is self-reported by participating clinics and organizations. During FY 2024–25, clinics and organizations reported a total of 1,075,210 donated hours valued at approximately \$163 million. In addition, 126 of the total 214 clinics and organizations reported receiving supplies, equipment, and monetary donations valued at approximately \$137 million. The combined value of volunteered services and donations totaled more than \$300 million during FY 20 24–25. Since the program's inception in 1992, participating clinics have reported more than \$5.8 billion in donated goods and services.
