Ms. Elliott made a motion to approve the amended July 27, 2017 General Business Meeting Minutes. Ms. Gammon seconded the motion which carried 4/0.

64B8-42.002 Licensure by Examination

64B8-44.0055 Notice of Non-Compliance- Minor Violations

64B8-44.007 Standards of Practice

64B8-45.002 Continuing Education Approval

During the October 2, 2017 Board of Medicine meeting the 64B8-45.002, F.A.C., Continuing Education Approval language was rejected.

Ms. Guillemette provided, for Council consideration, revised language for rule 64B8-45.002, F.A.C., Continuing Education Approval.

64B8-45.002 Continuing Education Approval.

(1) Continuing education credit shall be awarded for educational experiences received through the following methods:

(a) By <u>attendance and participating participation in any one</u> of the following dietetics or nutrition practice courses <u>approved by the Board effective June 1, 2017</u>:

1. Organized courses of post graduate study offered by or approved <u>subsequent to May 31, 2011</u> by the American Medical Association's Liaison Committee for Medical Education;

2. Organized courses sponsored or <u>approved subsequent to May 31, 2011</u> by the Public Health Service, state or territorial health services, or a branch of the United States Armed Services;

3. College courses from an approved graduate or undergraduate program which is accredited by an accrediting agency approved by the United States Department of Education or courses approved by any Board within the Division of Medical Quality Assurance of the Florida Department of Health and which course clearly relates relate to <u>the maintenance of maintaining</u> skills necessary for the safe and competent practice of dietetics and nutrition services, the licensee shall receive 15 continuing education credits for each semester hour of the course.

4. Organized courses offered by or approved subsequent to May 31, 2011 by the Commission on Dietetic Registration, or the Board for Certification of Nutrition Specialists.

(b) Attendance of a minimum of two hours at a scheduled public meeting of the Dietetics and Nutrition Practice Council, up to a maximum of 2 hours per biennium.

(c) A licensee who successfully completes a dietetic-related advanced certification exam offered or approved by the Commission on Dietetic Registration shall receive 28 hours of continuing education in the biennium in which the certification was awarded.

(d) (e) In addition to the continuing education credits authorized above, any volunteer expert witness who is providing expert witness opinions for cases being reviewed pursuant to Chapter 468, Part X, F.S., shall receive 2.5 hours of credit per case for performing a literature survey of at least two articles in conjunction with the review of cases for the Board up to a total of 5 hours per biennium.

(2) A lecturer or author presenting or authoring for the initial presentation a Board approved continuing education program that

meets the requirements of subsection (1) shall receive three hours continuing education credit for every one hour of program up to a maximum of fifteen hours of credit per biennium.

(3) A preceptor may earn 2 hours of continuing education credit for each 100 hours of supervised practice experience, up to a maximum of 8 hours per biennium. To be eligible for the credit, the preceptor must participate as the primary preceptor for a potential licensee. The primary preceptor is expected to maintain documentation of the persons trained, number of hours supervised, subject matter, and dates of training.

(4) Acceptable subject matter for continuing education programs include:

(a) Updates of knowledge and skills in dietetics and nutrition practice for competent performance beyond the minimum requirements for licensure;

(b) Food preparation that focuses on nutritional value;

- (c) Nutrition with specialized populations;
- (d) Assessment and treatment of various dietary and nutritional disorders;

(e) Innovative marketing strategies in dietetics and nutrition practice;

(f) Food service systems management.

- (5) Nonacceptable subject matter for continuing education programs include:
- (a) Professional association business meetings or delegate reports;
- (b) Menu planning;
- (c) Food service sanitation;
- (d) Cooking demonstrations;
- (e) Sales presentation on a company's new product;
- (f) Programs intended for or by the lay public.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Petrosky moved to approve the proposed rule language and directed counsel to proceed with rulemaking. The motion was seconded by Ms. Gammon and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Ms. Petrosky moved the rule would not have an adverse impact on small business nor was it likely to increase regulatory costs to any entity (including government) in excess of \$200,000 in Florida within 1 year after the implementation of the rule. The motion was seconded by Ms. Elliott and carried 5/0.

MOTION: Ms. Petrosky moved that a violation of this rule, or any part of this rule, would not be designated a minor violation. The motion was seconded by Ms. Elliott and carried 5/0.

10. Rule 64B8-44.055, F.A.C. Notice of Non-Compliance- Minor Violations

The Joint Administrative Procedures Committee (JAPC) issued a letter regarding proposed new rule 64B8- 44.0055, F.A.C, Notice of Non-Compliance – Minor Violations.

Ms. Guillemette provided her reply to JAPC and revised rule language.

64B8-44.0055 Notice of Non-Compliance – Minor Violations.

- (1) A Notice of noncompliance is a notification by the department issued to a licensee as a first response to a minor violation of <u>Board Council</u>-rule. It is not accompanied by a fine or other disciplinary penalty.
- (2) The <u>Board Council</u> designates the following as minor violations for which a notice of noncompliance may be issued for the first violationthereof:
 - (a) Failure to notify the Department of a change in address within 60 days, in violation of 456.035(3), F.S. and Rule 64B8-40.008, F.A.C.
 - (b) Failure to display license, in violation of <u>Rule 64B8-44.002, F.A.C. Section 468.512, F.S.</u>

Rulemaking Authority 120.695, 456.073(3), 468.507, F.S. Law Implemented 120.695, 456.073(3) FS. History-New - -17

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Elliott moved to approve the proposed rule language and directed counsel to proceed with rulemaking. The motion was seconded by Ms. Gammon and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Ms. Petrosky moved the rule would not have an adverse impact on small business nor was it likely to increase regulatory costs to any entity (including government) in excess of

\$200,000 in Florida within 1 (one) year after the implementation of the rule. The motion was seconded by Ms. Elliott and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Ms. Petrosky moved that a violation of this rule, or any part of this rule, would not be designated a minor violation. The motion was seconded by Ms. Elliott and carried 4/0.

1. Amanda Fernandez (Examination with Waiver)

Ms. Fernandez was present.

Ms. Amanda Fernandez applied for licensure by examination with waiver. Her application was presented for review of her CNS certification and her 900 pre-professional hours. Ms. Fernandez received her Master's degree in Nutrition from the University of Miami.

MOTION: Ms. Elliott made a motion to approve Ms. Fernandez's application. Ms. Norris seconded the motion which carried 5/0.

2. Awilda Carrasquillo-Forty (Endorsement of Another State License)

Ms. Carrasquillo-Forty was not present.

Ms. Carrasquillo-Forty applied for licensure by endorsement of another state license. Ms Carrasquillo-Forty was denied licensure on February 9, 2017 due to not having a current and active Puerto Rico license. Ms.Carrasquillo-Forty provided a current Puerto Rico license and has reapplied for licensure.

MOTION: Ms. Petrosky made a motion to approve Ms. Carrasquillo-Forty's once she amends her application to reflect the correct answering of question number (7) seven. Ms. Rex seconded the motion which carried 5/0.

3. Dina Jo Foley (Endorsement of CDR Registration)
