17 Ms. Munson presented the following amendments to the current rule draft in response to
18 correspondence received from the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee (JAPC) on July
19 5, 2018.

64B8-51.002 Licensure by Examination.

21 (1) Every applicant for licensure as an electrologist by examination shall demonstrate to the Council that the applicant:

22 (a) through (d) No change.

23 (e) Has successfully completed the requirements of a Council-approved pre-licensure epilator electrolysis-training
24 program approved by the Council for: consisting of 120 hours academic training and a minimum of 200 hours of practical application
25 or the combined epilator, laser, and light-based standards consistent with the requirements of Rule 64B8-53.002, F.A.C.

26 1. The combined epilator, laser, and light-based curriculum defined in Rules 64B8-53.002, Florida Administrative Code,
27 effective February 15, 2017; or

28 2. The epilator curriculum required for applicants who completed the training prior to March 1, 2018.

29 (f) and (g) No change.

30 (2) The Electrolysis Licensure Examination shall be: any national examination pursuant to Section 456.017, F.S. and
31 approved by the Board that tests on the combined epilator, laser, and light-based standards consistent with the requirements of
32 Rule 64B8-53.002, F.A.C. for the practice of electrology. The requirements and standards of the national examination shall comply
33 with the requirements set forth in Rule 64B-1.011, F.A.C., effective 3/19/2012, which is incorporated herein by reference, and
34 available from <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref->

35 (3) and (4) No change.

3 Following discussion, the Council determined to revise the language in Paragraph (1)(e) as
4 follows:

5 (1) Every applicant for licensure as an electrologist by examination shall demonstrate to the Council that the applicant:

6 (e) Has successfully completed the requirements of an Council-approved pre-licensure electrolysis training program
7 consisting of 120 hours academic training and a minimum of 200 hours of practical application for the epilator-only training program
8 or the combined epilator, laser, and light-based training program consistent with the requirements of Rule 64B8-53.002, F.A.C.

9 Ms. Jolynn Greenhalgh moved to approve all proposed changes to the rule language presented,
10 as amended. Ms. Sarah Gray seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

11 Ms. Jolynn Greenhalgh moved the proposed rule language would not have an adverse impact
12 on small business nor have an economic impact on government or any other entity in excess of
13 \$200,000 within one year of the rule being implemented. Ms. Sarah Gray seconded the motion,
14 which carried 4/0.

15 Ms. Jolynn Greenhalgh moved the proposed rule language should not be designated as a minor
16 violation for first time offenses. Ms. Sarah Gray seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.
