FLORIDA SYRINGE EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Read the statute that permits county commissions to authorize syringe exchange programs:

Section 381.0038, Florida Statutes.



Opioid misuse fuels the increase of infectious diseases connected to injection drug use.

Currently, injection drug use is the cause of most new **hepatitis C** infections. Injection drug use is also a risk factor for **hepatitis A and B** infections.



From 2010 to 2016, the U.S. experienced a 3.5-fold increase of **hepatitis C** virus cases.



Starting in 2010, with each year there has been an average of 2,500 new **HIV infections** among people who inject drugs in the U.S.

Syringe Exchange Programs: A Good IDEA for Florida's Communities



By providing new and sterile syringes to people who inject drugs, syringe exchange programs help **reduce HIV and viral hepatitis** infections.
