How do I respond to a patient request for a copy of their report?

Do **NOT** provide a report to anyone.

What if I see my home address on the Patient Report?

Your E-FORCSE® account profile is not used on the patient report. Check the addresses you have associated with your DEA registration and/or NPI profile and update as necessary.

REGISTRATION FAQS

 I had an account previously. How do I register to get a new account?

Do Not Register Again!
See the E-FORCSE® Profile Maintenance page.

• I haven't had an account in the past, where do I register for a new account? Navigate to https://florida.pmpaware.net and select the "Create Account" link.

WHAT ROLE TYPE DO I SELECT?

- If you are accessing patient reports on behalf of a prescriber or pharmacist, use the corresponding "Delegate Unlicensed" role.
- If you are a prescriber and do not have a DEA registration number, use the "Prescriber without DEA" role.
- If you are a prescriber and have a DEA registration, number select the role that corresponds to your license type (e.g., **Physician, Dentist**).
- Pharmacists select the "Pharmacist" role.
- Non-Florida Licensed federally employed prescribers and dispensers navigate to the E-FORCSE® Health Care Practitioner Information webpage to view the registration Ouick Reference Guide at www.e-forcse.com.



Have a new email address or not receiving password reset emails?

Even though you may not have access to the email address or do not receive the password reset by email notices for your existing account username, you can reset your password by text to your mobile phone number.

• Account Locked?

Your account will lock after **4** unsuccessful attempts. You will need to wait **10** minutes and the account will automatically unlock. The lock cannot be overridden.

Need to update your: primary phone contact, role, NPI, DEA, license, name or practice information?

Email e-forcse@flhealth.gov and include DOB, last 4 digits of SS#, name, and existing username along with the new information.

Please Note: A re-verification process is performed daily, so it is important to keep your account up-to-date.
