TALLAHASSEE - The Florida Department of Health has announced Aaron Kissler as the new administrator for the Florida Department of Health in Lake County. Since July 2012, Kissler has served as the administrator of the Florida Department of Health in Gadsden County.

Kissler's prior experience in Florida includes serving in Broward County as Environmental Health Specialist and in program evaluation for the Healthy Start Douala program at the University of South Florida. In addition, Kissler served as project coordinator at UCLA, a Hurricane Katrina field director and the GIS manager at the University of South Carolina.

Aaron Kissler graduated from the University of Colorado with a Bachelor of Science in Anthropology and earned his Master of Public Health Degree with a concentration in Environmental Health from the University of South Florida. Kissler was awarded the *Answering the Call* medal from former U.S. President George W. Bush for his role in response to Hurricane Katrina.
