The lab was formed in 1914 as an extension of the Central Lab in Jacksonville in order to meet the high demands for laboratory services. In 1901, the Jacksonville Central lab was created after Florida's first State Health Officer, Dr. Joseph Yates Porter, emphasized the urgent need for a laboratory to aid in the diagnosis of certain diseases.

Today, the Miami Lab is one of Florida's four Public Health Laboratories that provides information to over 20 Federal and State Agencies, 67 county offices of the Florida Department of Health, 500 licensed clinical laboratories, 450 certified environmental laboratories, 19 million residents and 95 million visitors annually.
