Florida has the country's third largest veteran population and is home to 231,000 veterans returning from Iraq and Afghanistan. The department understands the critical need to serve Florida's veterans, and is dedicated to becoming the most veteran-friendly state in the nation.

On July 1, 2014 the department launched the Veterans Application for Licensure Online Response (VALOR) System which expedites licensing for military veterans who apply six months before or after honorable discharge. The state also extended fee waiver eligibility to military veterans and their spouses for health care provider licenses up to 60 months after honorable discharge.
