WHEREAS, registered professional school nurses provide services that range from vision and hearing screenings to complex medical procedures, medication administration, sick care, first aid and prevention of communicable diseases; and

WHEREAS, registered professional school nurses are uniquely positioned to reduce health barriers to learning which helps Florida students graduate and become self-supporting adults; and

WHEREAS, Florida School Nurse Day provides a special opportunity to commend all of Florida's registered school nurses for their professionalism and dedication, and encourage Floridians to learn more about the work of the registered school nurses who care for our children:
