



# Hepatitis A Surveillance

January 1, 2018–January 16, 2021


From January 1, 2018 through January 16, 2021, 4,962 hepatitis A cases were reported.

The number of reported hepatitis A cases more than doubled from 2016 to 2017 and nearly doubled again in 2018 after remaining relatively stable in previous years. Case counts in 2019 saw an over 500% increase from 2018.


Counties that reported hepatitis A cases in the past two weeks are outlined in black. Since January 1, 2018, 98% of cases have likely been acquired locally in Florida.



The graph below represents hepatitis A cases by week from December 29, 2019 to January 16, 2021. There were 14 hepatitis A cases reported in the past two weeks.



The graph below represents hepatitis A cases by month from January 1, 2018 to January 16, 2021. Case counts in weeks prior to the public health emergency declaration are shown in light red, while case counts in weeks since are shown in red.






# Hepatitis A Vaccination Surveillance

January 1, 2019–January 16, 2021

From January 3, 2021 to January 16, 2021, county health departments (CHDs) administered 163 (15%) of the total 1,059 first doses of hepatitis A vaccine administered to adults age 18 years and older, as recorded in Florida SHOTS.



In 2019 CHDs have administered 164,779 vaccinations and non-CHDs have administered 229,539 vaccinations for a total of 394,318 vaccinations. Vaccinations given before the public health emergency declaration are shown in lighter colors than those given after. Since declaration of the PHE, CHDs have administered 99,158 and non-CHDs have administered 137,006 vaccinations.
