### STATE OF FLORIDA BOARD OF MASSAGE THERAPY

### FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Board of Massage Therapy (hereinafter Board) pursuant to §120.565, Florida Statutes, and Rule 28-105, Florida Administrative Code, at a duly-noticed meeting in Orlando, Florida on July 28, 2017, for the purpose of considering the Petition for Declaratory Statement (attached as Exhibit A) filed on behalf of ANGELA LIND (hereinafter Petitioner). Having considered the petition, the arguments submitted by counsel for Petitioner, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings and conclusions.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. This petition was noticed by the Board in Vol. 43, No. 93, dated May 11, 2017 of the Florida Administrative Register.

2. Petitioner is a massage therapist licensed to practice in the State of Florida, having license number MA 45645.

3. Petitioner offers manual lymphatic drainage in her practice.

4. Manual lymphatic drainage alleviates the swelling and bruising that occur after surgery.

5. The majority of Petitioner's clients who request manual lymphatic drainage are individuals recovering from cosmetic surgery.

6. Petitioner inquires whether it is within the scope of her practice to force or

push blood and body fluids out of open wounds and surgical incisions.

7. Forcing or pushing fluids out of the body creates exudate.

8. Section 480.033(3) defines "massage" as:

the manipulation of the soft tissues of the human body with the hand, foot, arm, or elbow, whether or not such manipulation is aided by hydrotherapy, including colonic irrigation, or thermal therapy; any electrical or mechanical device; or the application to the human body of a chemical or herbal preparation.

9. The definition of massage does not include exuding fluids from open wounds.

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1. The Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 120.565,

Florida Statutes, and Rule 28-105, Florida Administrative Code.

2. The petition filed in this cause is in substantial compliance with the provisions

of Section 120.565, Florida Statutes, and Rule 28-105, Florida Administrative Code.

WHEREFORE, the Board hereby finds that under the specific facts of the

petition, as set forth above, it is not within the scope of Petitioner's practice to force

body fluids out of open wounds or surgical incisions.
