01. Welcome to New Council Member: Ms. Susan Manwaring

Ms. Manwaring was not present on the call.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

02. Ricardo Sabates (Examination)

Dr. Sabates was present on the call.

Dr. Sabates' application and request for temporary permit was before the Council to be reviewed for the following reasons:

Dr. Sabates' medical license was suspended for a period of four years with a probationary period of six years. The Council was provided with documents relating to the discipline of his medical license.

Upon inquiry by the Council, Dr. Sabates assured the members the Council of his awareness of the standard of care required for practice as an Electrologist and indicated he would follow the rules and mandates set forth by the Council. Dr. Sabates also stated his understanding of the requirement for direct supervision of electrologists who perform laser hair removal and indicated that Dr. Benjamin Sharpe will supervise him

1 and conduct all initial consultations until the licensee's own medical license is restored
2 next year.

3
4 **MOTION:** Mr. James Scott moved to accept Dr. Ricardo Sabates' examination
5 application. Ms. Audra Kinney seconded the motion, which carried 3/1. Ms. Margaret
6 Haley opposed.

11 Ms. Tanya Culver was present on the call.

13 Ms. Culver's application is before the Council's review for the following reason:

15 Ms. Culver responded yes to question number 9 on the licensure application regarding
16 previous criminal history. Provided for the Council's review were documents relating to
17 Ms. Culver's criminal history.

19 **MOTION:** Shelby Owens moved to accept Ms. Tanya Culver's examination application.
20 Jim Scott seconded the motion, which carried 3/1. Ms. Margaret Haley opposed.

7 **RULES REVIEW AND DEVELOPMENT**

8
9 **07. Rule 64B8-51.002, F.A.C., Licensure by Examination**

10
11 The re-examination application has been updated to incorporate questions pertaining to
12 *Section 456.0635, F.S., Medicaid fraud; disqualification for license, certificate, or*
13 *registration.* The questions added are the same as those currently required on the initial
14 electrologist licensure application under Section 456.0635 History.

15
16 Any time changes are made to a Council form; the revision of the form must be noted
17 and incorporated in rule. Provided for the Council's consideration was the updated form,
18 as well as proposed rule language which incorporated the form into rule.

19
20 The Council directed Ms. Norr to amend the rule language to incorporate the revised
21 form.

22
23 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved to accept the proposed rule language. Ms. Audra
24 Kinney seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

25
26 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved that the proposed new language would not have an
27 adverse impact on small business. Additionally, the proposed rule amendments would
28 not be likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity (including
29 government) in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida within one year after the
30 implementation of the rule. Mr. Jim Scott seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

31
32
33 **08. Rules 64B8-52.003(2) & (3), F.A.C., Procedure for Approval of Attendance at**
34 **Continuing Education Courses**

35
36 The Council Office has received questions from licensees, as well as the Department's
37 continuing education audit unit, requesting clarification concerning the HIV/AIDS
38 requirement in Rule 64B8-52.003(3)(b), F.A.C.

39
40 Ms. Norr indicated that she consulted with the Board of Medicine's attorney, who
41 clarified that this was intended to only be a one-time continuing education (CE)
42 requirement for new licensees. Other licensees are only required to take a one (1)-hour
43 blood-borne disease course for renewal each licensure biennium. The Council agreed
44 that the rule language should be modified to reflect such. The following modification was
45 proposed to the current language:

46
47 (3) HIV/AIDS and blood-borne disease continuing education requirements.

48 (a) **Each new licensee is required to complete no later than upon first renewal**
49 **an approved course on HIV/AIDS education.** Approved offerings in HIV/AIDS are
50 those that meet the requirements of Section 465.033, F.S. Courses approved by any
51 Board within the Division of Medical Quality Assurance of the Department of Health

1 pursuant to Section 456.033, F.S., are approved by this Council.

2
3 **ACTION TAKEN:** The Council voted to have Ms. Norr modify the language.

4
5 **MOTION:** Mr. Jim Scott moved to accept the rule language. Ms. Audra Kinney seconded
6 the motion, which carried 4/0.

7
8 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved to accept the rule development. Mr. Jim Scott
9 seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

10
11 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved that the proposed new language would not have
12 an adverse impact on small business. Additionally, the proposed rule amendments
13 would not be likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity
14 (including government) in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida within one year
15 after the implementation of the rule. Mr. Jim Scott seconded the motion, which carried
16 4/0.

17
18 Mr. Jon Pellet, Esquire, requested that proposed modifications to Rule 64B8-52.003(2),
19 F.A.C., previously approved by the Council on July 18, 2011, be brought back before the
20 Council for discussion regarding other amendments to the rule proposed by the Board of
21 Medicine on September 30, 2011, as follows:

22
23 (2) All licensees shall be awarded contact hours for attendance at all offerings that
24 are approved by the Electrolysis Society of Florida (ESF), or the Electrolysis Association
25 of Florida (EAF), or the American Electrology Association, or the Society of Clinical and
26 Medical Hair Removal, and all offerings from other states which are approved by the
27 states' licensing agency or professional electrology organization which offerings have
28 been approved by the American Electrology Association, or the Society of Clinical and
29 Medical Hair Removal, **or any technical school, college or university course, or**
30 **course from a Board-approved program pursuant to 64B8-53.001, F.A.C.,** taken and
31 successfully completed for the first time by the licensee in a subject area relevant to
32 electrolysis.. The licensee shall provide verification upon request of the Department.

33
34 During the discussion, information was provided to explain that the reference to
35 "technical school" was previously approved for deletion, as it was found that the
36 Department of Education appears to now refer to such programs as "non-public
37 postsecondary schools". It was also clarified that the original purpose of the Council's
38 modification was based upon inquiry from one of the approved 320-hour electrolysis
39 training programs seeking to offer CE courses for licensees, but not being allowed to do
40 so by *CE Broker*, due to uncertainty about whether these programs fell under the
41 "technical school" category.

42
43 Additionally, there was discussion about whether CE courses taken through these
44 schools should be required to seek approval through one of the national organizations
45 currently referenced in this rule.

46
47 **Motion:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved to table the discussion until all members were
48 present on the call. Ms. Margaret Haley seconded the motion which carried 4/0.

1 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved to have Ms. Norr draft language to discuss at the
2 next meeting. Mr. Jim Scott seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.
3

5 **09. RULES REVIEW AND/OR DEVELOPMENT**

6
7 **Rule 64B8-52.004(3), Requirements for Approval of Training Courses for Laser and**
8 **Light-Based Hair Removal or Reduction**

9
10 At the July 18, 2011, general business meeting, the Council voted to have the Council
11 chair, Ms. Shelby Owens, work with assistant attorney general, Mr. Mike Flury, in
12 developing language that would establish requirements for new laser certification
13 providers.

14
15 [- Minutes from July 18, 2011 -]

16
17 **Rule 64B8-52.004(3), Requirements for Approval of Training Courses for**
18 **Laser and Light-Based Hair Removal or Reduction**

19
20 During their June 22, 2011, Board of Medicine's Dietetics/Nutrition and Electrolysis
21 committee meeting the amended language from the Electrolysis May 02, 2011, meeting
22 for this rule was approved. Later in the meeting, during discussion of Rule 64B8-
23 56.002(2)(b), the committee requested further action for this rule. They requested this
24 rule be sent back to the Electrolysis Council for development of criteria/standards for
25 approving training programs and certifying agencies.

26
27 During discussion, the Council agreed that the exam questions should be centered on
28 the specific topic that certification is being sought for, and should also include ethics,
29 sanitation and record keeping. Language should also be added to specify that
30 organizations must apply to the Council for approval.

31
32 Ms. Judy Adams, with the Electrology Society of Florida (ESF), mentioned that if there
33 are other professions that have established criteria, the Council could possibly mimic
34 some of their standards. It was mentioned that the Board of Massage has national
35 examination standards which staff may seek to obtain to assist the Council in
36 establishing its criteria.

37
38 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved to have staff research other professions for similar
39 criteria. Mr. Jim Scott seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.
40

41
42 **10. Rule 64B8-56.002(2)(b), Equipment and Devices; Protocols for Laser and**
43 **Light-based Devices**

44
45 Ms. Norr advised that this rule is on hold because it relates to Rule 64B8-52.004(3),
46 Requirements for Approval of Training Courses for Laser and Light-Based Hair Removal
47 or Reduction. The rule has not yet been noticed, so there is no barrier preventing the
48 Council from working on criteria language.

49
50 Additionally, Council staff sought to obtain verification as to whether the Council would
51 like to affirm its decision to abandon previously proposed language that would require

1 licensees to obtain “current certification” by a national credentialing organization in order
2 to be able to provide laser hair removal services. The Council was provided with the
3 official minutes of the Board of Medicine’s committee regarding their December 1, 2011
4 action on this rule, as well as previously reviewed information.

5
6 Following discussion, the Council took the following action:

7
8 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved to drop the issue and leave the certification
9 language as is. Ms. Margaret Haley seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

10
11 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved to approve the removal of “and the board.” Ms.
12 Margaret Haley seconded the motion, which carried 4/0. The revised draft language
13 should read as follows:

14
15 (b) Have been certified in the use of laser and light-based devices for the removal or
16 reduction of hair by a national certification organization approved by the Council ~~and the~~
17 ~~Board~~;

18
19 **MOTION:** Ms. Shelby Owens moved that the proposed new language would not have an
20 adverse impact on small business. Additionally, the proposed rule amendments would
21 not be likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity (including
22 government) in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida within one year after the
23 implementation of the rule. Mr. Jim Scott seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

31 **15. Discussion: Long Distance Supervision of Temporary Electrologist**

32 **Licensees**

33

34 Section 478.46(2), F.S., Temporary Permits, requires the following of licensed
35 electrologists who have agreed to supervise a temporary permittee:

36

- 37 • Provision of the initial direction in developing a treatment plan;
- 38 • Periodic inspection of the permittee’s implementation of the plan;
- 39 • Consultation and approval of any proposed alterations of the plan prior to
40 implementation;
- 41 • The availability of the supervisor to consult with and direct the permittee in an
42 emergency, although the supervisor does not have to be on the premises while the
43 permittee is delivering electrolysis services.

44

45 In processing an application for facility licensure, an issue of concern was raised
46 regarding the ability for a temporary permittee to own and provide services in a facility,
47 where no other licensed electrologists would be employed, and the supervising licensee
48 would be more than 20 miles away from the facility site.

49

1 | Staff requested the Council's consideration of the appropriateness of supervision of a
2 temporary permittee, when the distance between the supervisor and permittee appears
3 to be significant. There was also discussion regarding the possibility for a temporarily
4 permitted applicant to continuously put off sitting for the examination, because there are
5 currently no limitations on the timeframe in which a temporary permittee must pass the
6 examination.

7
8 The Council indicated that it did not see the need for a limitation of distance between an
9 electrology supervisor and temporary permittee as the supervision could be done
10 electronically with today's technology. There did not appear to be any concerns with
11 violating The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA) as long as
12 personal information is not transmitted. The Council agreed that there should be a one
13 year maximum to take the exam or the temporary permit will be revoked.

14
15 **MOTION:** Ms. Margaret Haley moved to develop language for a one year time limit for
16 an applicant to sit for the IBEC exam after a temporary permit is issued to include a
17 provision for individuals to petition for an extension if unless special circumstances arise.
