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Introduction

This is the annual review report for the 2017-2020 Pasco County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). The activities and collaborative efforts of the Florida Department of Health (DOH) in Pasco County and community partners will be reflected within the report. This document will serve as a progress review of the strategies that were developed and the activities that have been implemented. While the CHIP is a community driven and collectively owned health improvement plan, the Florida Department of Health in Pasco County is charged with providing administrative support, tracking data, collecting data, and preparing the annual review report.

DOH-Pasco County's CHIP liaison checks in quarterly with all focus area leaders via the phone or email. Currently, this is an opportunity for improvement trying to connect with all focus area leaders. However, when the parties can converse, updates and revisions are made to each action plan. The progress is then shared at the bi-annual CHIP reporting meeting. The leads report on progress, barriers, and revisions, at that time community and partners input are solicited. Based on community response, action plans are reviewed. The meeting notes are available on pasco.floridahealth.gov webpage, as well as, all focus area team leads contact information. This transparency allows community members to directly access the focus area team leads with any questions or comments.

Overview of the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)

In September 2016, the Department of Health in Pasco County assembled a CHIP planning team that they titled Collective Impact Meetings. During the Collective Impact meetings, subject matter experts from across a diverse group of partners conducted two assessments. Individually, the assessment yielded indepth analyses of factors and forces that impact population health. Taken together, the assessment findings contribute to a comprehensive view of health and quality of life in Pasco County.

During the meetings, subject matter experts presented on the key health issues. Approximately 26 community health partners, discussed and weighed based on feasibility and impact on the community. Based on the outcomes the attendees agreed on four strategic issue areas: Access to Care, Health and Well-being, Infectious Disease, and Healthy Babies. See Table below for Strategic Issue Areas with their goals, developed by a workgroup of subject matter experts.

Since implementation of the goals, the Department of Health has taken a lead in tracking the implementation of the plan. There are quarterly check-ins with focus group leads to revisit and revise the plan and bi-annual report outs that are open to the community to ensure the community is kept abreast of ongoing health improvement activities.

Summary of CHIP Annual Review Meeting

During the bi-annual meeting held on February 21, 2018 and August 30, 2018, approximately fifty people from various agencies attended. The meeting allowed focus area leads to share the progress, strengths, barriers, and needs of the groups. As well as allowed attendees to ask questions and potentially join a group.

Limited access to health care services, may contribute to poor health outcomes and high health care costs. Many socioeconomic and social determinates influence health outcomes. To assist the public health system, the CHIP focuses on four key areas that community members are underserved. They are uninsured children, housing for the homeless, mental health services for persons with co-occurring disorders, and oral health availability.

Why this is important to our community:

In January 2016, Continuums of Care (CoCs) conducted an unduplicated count of homeless persons per HUD standards. Based on that report, Florida had 33,559 persons that were in transitional housing, emergency shelter, or unsheltered. In 2013, the statistics for Pasco County report that 3,305 persons were homeless on any given day, with 1,082 of those persons having a household with at least one adult and one child (http://www.pascohomelesscoalition.org/about-homelessness/; http://www.pascohomelesscoalition.org/wp-content/uploads/2014/01/ReportBook2013.pdf).

Strategic Issue Area #4: Healthy Babies

Infant mortality is a key measure of population health and the rate of infant deaths in Pasco County is equivalent to the overall rate for the entire state of Florida (6.1% per 1,000 live births). The Healthy Babies initiative is a collaboration of community partners who are working together to address health disparities and improve the overall health of women of child-bearing age, pregnant women, and their babies. Overall health is important as it affects the health status of the mother and birth outcomes of the baby; having healthy mothers' correlates to healthy babies. The Pasco County Community Health Collaborative has chosen to focus on promoting Preconceptual and Interconceptual health, promoting baby spacing for 18 months, and increasing awareness of the benefits of long acting reversible contraceptives (LARC's). By improving education and increasing awareness of healthy behaviors, the result will be a reduction in premature births, reduction of substance-exposed newborns, and decreased rates of infant mortality.

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Goal II: To improve safe-sleep practices and prevent SUID (sudden unexpected infant death) related infant mortality by educating parents and community partners.


Strategy 1: Facilitate partnerships with local community agencies and organizations to educate their clients and staff about safe sleep practices and SUID prevention. This will be accomplished through individual and group education and the distribution of Pack N Plays, Halo sleep sacks, and safe sleep children's books and literature.

Why this is important to our community:


Children under the age of 1 represent 97% of unsafe sleep fatalities in Florida, making unsafe sleep a leading cause of preventable infant death in our state. One of the most common sleep dangers for infants is sleeping in an adult bed; this accounts for 40% of unsafe sleep deaths (FDCF, 2013). The Pasco County Healthy Babies Safe Sleep Initiative will address this public health issue by educating community partners, pregnant women, and new parents about safe sleep practices and SUID prevention. This will be accomplished through individual parent education conducted by CHD clinic, Healthy Start, and WIC staff. We will also facilitate group educational presentations for community partner staff. All parents and staff receiving safe sleep education from Healthy Start and Healthy Babies staff members will participate in a pre and post test to determine their knowledge gained from the presentation. We will utilize the train-the-trainer model for community partner staff to educate their clients. We will provide educational materials to parents and community partners, as well as distribute it to local businesses. The presentations and educational materials will increase the knowledge of community partner staff and parents regarding how to eliminate sleep dangers for infants, thereby reducing infant mortality. We will provide Pack N Plays and/or Halo sleep sacks and a Safe Sleep children's book to randomly selected parents who have received safe sleep education. By providing parents with a safe sleep environment for their infant, this will increase the parents' ability to practice SUID prevention in their home. Distribution of the children's safe sleep books will promote and increase early childhood literacy by encouraging parents to read to their baby.
