Call to Order, Member Roll Call - Maggie Dilger, Florida Department of Health

The meeting was called to order at 12:05 p.m., Roll was taken, and a quorum was not established.

Member Updates - Council Members

Dr. Barry Byrne shared that he met with Dr. Pradeep Bhide of Florida State University (FSU) to plan ongoing interactions between FSU and the University of Florida (UF) as FSU begins its infrastructure and collaborations for its pediatric rare disease institute.

There was conversation regarding newborn screening in Florida and around the nation as additional diseases are being added that will provide early detection and treatment. The discussion moved to creating a patient registry from diagnosis through treatment in an effort to understand risk factors for better outcomes. It was noted that New York has a similar registry as a reference. The group expressed the importance of health

outcomes data and sharing the economics of treated patients versus untreated patients with policymakers as there is value to the state in identifying and tracking health results. UF's Health Outcomes and Biomedical Informatics (HOBI) team could be a resource.

The group brainstormed ideas to engage the RDAC with other advisory councils, subject matter experts, and patient-centered organizations to continue the work of the council.
