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## **School Health Services Program Data Summaries for School Year 2023-2024**

Since 2013, the Florida Department of Health has published School Health Services Program Data Summaries. These summaries compile essential data points that help evaluate the performance and impact of the School Health Services Program throughout Florida.

To ensure consistency and document changes over time, this cover page serves as a repository for modifications made to the data set during the current publication. Changes are driven by factors such as data quality improvement, policy updates, and reporting requirements.

The following updates and changes were implemented for the 2023-24 data summaries:

- Under "Expenditures for School Health Services", the data point "County Health Department (CHD) - state, federal, local and other funds" has been refined to "County Health Department (CHD) - state and federal funds". This provides a more comprehensive picture of the program's annual core funding situation.
- Under "Core School Health Services Provided During 2022-2023", the "All other services" data point, we've refined our data point aggregation algorithm to improve accuracy. As a result, there is a noticeable drop in aggregated data compared to previous year reports. However, this change ensures that our aggregation tool now provides a more precise representation of our service data in this point, eliminating duplicate values that were previously included in error.

These changes will be the standard for future reports unless otherwise noted on this cover page.

**Tracking Dataset Updates:**

**School Year 2022-23**

- School sites (elementary, middle, high, and combined level schools) for each county are based on the official count of public schools reported by the Florida Department of Education.
- School health expenditures under “County Health Department (CHD) - state, federal, local, and other funds,” specifically the portions attributed to state and federal funding, are now sourced from the state-level reports provided by the Office of Budget and Revenue Management.
- Definitions for student health conditions have been refined. These updated parameters have been disseminated to local offices, ensuring a standardized and enhanced approach to the data gathering processes.
