

The Florida Department of Health invites our health care partners to enroll in electronic case reporting (eCR). Let's put the days of faxing behind us!

What is eCR?

eCR is the automated real-time exchange of case report information between electronic health records (EHRs) and public health. Traditionally, health care providers have needed to manually compile and send case reports for reportable conditions to health departments via fax, phone call, or email. eCR provides an alternative to these time-consuming manual processes by making it possible to automatically generate case reports from electronic health records and transmit them via a secure, web-based platform.

Why participate in eCR?



Fulfill the legal obligation to report conditions of public health concern with less administrative burden.



Reduce the number of phone calls and medical records requests related to epidemiologic investigations.



Get credit for participating in the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services promoting interoperability programs.




Improve the efficiency and effectiveness of disease detection, surveillance, investigation, and response.

Who participates in eCR?

- As of December 2025, **689** Florida health care organizations, comprised of **4940** hospitals, urgent care centers, specialty centers, and clinics are participating in eCR, across **61** Florida counties.
- **99%** of organizations are submitting eCRs for all reportable conditions, as opposed to a subset of reportables.
