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School Health Services Program Overview

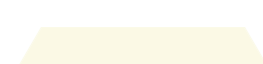


For over 50 years, Florida’s School Health Services Program, housed within the Florida Department of Health (Department), has partnered with the Florida Department of Education and local school districts to deliver essential health services in public schools. The program is authorized and guided by section 381.0056, Florida Statutes, known as the School Health Services Act, which outlines the responsibilities of the Department and local partners in delivering school-based health services. Operating through all 67 county health departments (CHD), the program ensures services are delivered consistently and according to best practices.

The program is built on coordination, efficiency, and strength. It forms a statewide network that supports local implementation, maximizes resources, and ensures every student has access to basic health services.

Each school district in Florida operates as a unique entity with its own organizational structure, funding model, and service delivery system. Backed by state and federal funding, the Department provides a framework that enables consistent assessment, prevention, mitigation, and management of student health conditions. Resulting in a healthier, supportive learning environment for all students.

The Department’s State Health Office provides leadership, technical assistance, and oversight to the program, while also collecting and analyzing health data reported by local school health program offices. These efforts support students, families, and schools in the shared goal of keeping students healthy and ready to learn.



Annual Data Elements Explanation

Each local school health program submits data annually to the State Health Office’s School Health Services Program. This section serves as a reference and contains a description of the data elements in this report.

Client Population

The client population for the School Health Services Program is the total number of students enrolled in public schools (including charter schools) within each county. These enrollment figures are obtained directly from the Florida Department of Education’s standardized data reporting tools. Student enrollment data is drawn from the “Enrollment/Membership (Student Enrollment) in Florida Public Schools” report, specifically the Survey 2, which is typically published between December and February each school year. The number of public schools is based on the “Number of Elementary, Middle/Junior High, High, and Combination Schools, K-12 General Education, by District” dataset. Both data sources are available through the Department’s PK-12 Public School Data Publications and Reports.

Student Health Conditions

Each year, school districts report the number of students with documented health conditions. Most conditions require a health care provider’s diagnosis, except for Attention-Deficit / Hyperactivity Disorder, non-life-threatening allergies, mental health conditions, and “Other.” The “Other” category is defined as any condition lasting one year or more that requires ongoing medical attention, limits daily activities, or both (e.g. Crohn’s disease).

Because data collection methods may vary, year-to-year changes may reflect reporting practices rather than actual shifts in student health. The State Health Office works closely with CHDs and school districts to ensure consistent reporting. This data informs planning and ensures students with complex health conditions receive appropriate support.

Annual Data Elements Explanation

Student Needing Medication and Procedures

This data reflects the number of students in each district who require a health care provider ordered, prescription-labeled medication or medical procedures (and/or a parent authorization if a physician's order is not required such as over-the-counter medications) during the school day. Each student is counted once per medication route or procedure type, not by the number of doses or procedures performed. For example, a student receiving two oral medications is counted once under oral medications. A student receiving one oral medication, one inhaled medication, and one procedure is counted once in each category.

As with other self-reported data, variations may occur due to local reporting practices. The State Health Office reviews submissions annually and works with CHDs and school districts to verify data quality when discrepancies arise.

Understanding the number of students needing medication or procedural support is essential for planning, staffing, and ensuring safe, effective care in schools.

Expenditures for School Health Services

Funding for school health services is reported across four primary categories:

State and Federal Funds Managed by the Department: This category includes general revenue allocated by the State Health Office and federal funding reimbursed by the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration. While state funding has remained constant, the federal reimbursement has decreased over time.

School District Expenditures: These expenditures are self-reported by local school districts. When a school district contracts with the Department to deliver school health services, those funds are reported under the school district category.

Community Partner Contributions: Also, self-reported by school districts, this category includes in-kind services, grants, or direct funding from local organizations and community partners.

Expenditure Per Student Rate: To assess the relative investment in school health services, total reported expenditures across all categories are divided by the student population to calculate a per-student expenditure rate. This metric provides context for funding levels statewide and supports comparisons across counties and school years.

Health Staff in Schools

Staffing data is collected consistently across all counties. The size and composition of the workforce directly impacts service capacity, and discrepancies in staffing data can affect how the program evaluates county-level reporting.

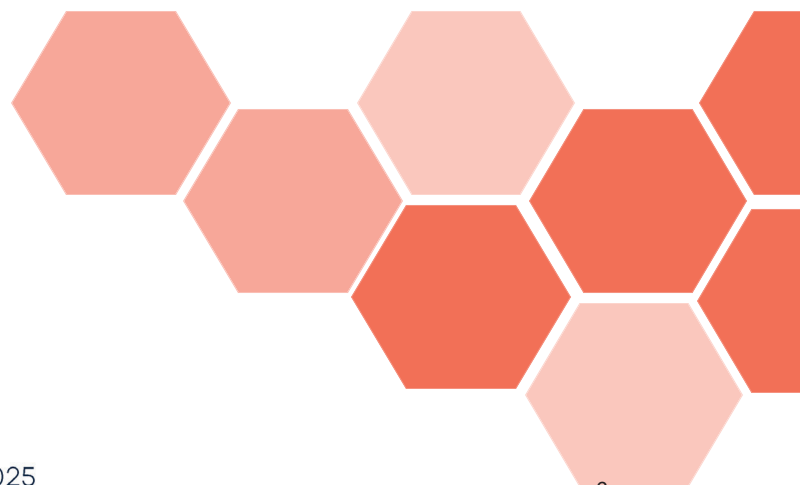
Staffing is reported in two categories:

1. Non-Exceptional Student Education (ESE) Health Staff: Serve the general student population and represent the program's overall staff.
2. ESE Health Staff: Support students with intensive medical needs, not funded through the school health services program.

County health departments, school districts, and community partners report full-time equivalent counts for non-ESE health staff, including registered nurses (RNs), licensed practical nurses, and health aides or technicians providing direct care. Administrative or supervisory RNs are excluded.

The report also includes RN caseload ratios for non-ESE health staff, calculated by dividing the student population and number of schools by the number of RNs in each county. This provides a snapshot of nurse-to-student and nurse-to-school coverage.

A separate section captures staffing and caseload data for ESE health staff, reflecting the specialized care required for medically fragile students.



Annual Data Elements Explanation

Core School Health Services

Core school health services are a standardized set of services delivered by both school district personnel and Department staff. These services are documented in the Department's Health Management System and tracked consistently across all counties.

Throughout the school year, each CHD is responsible for collecting service data from school districts, recording their own activities, and submitting all information according to established reporting categories. While each district uses its own system to compile data, CHD staff review submissions and conduct quality checks to ensure accuracy and consistency.

These core service metrics provide a statewide view of program performance and serve as a foundation for identifying opportunities to enhance service delivery and strengthen program operations.

Return-to-Class Rate

A key indicator of program impact is the percentage of students who return to class after visiting the school clinic. This measure reflects the program's core goal: keeping students healthy, in school, and ready to learn.

The rate is calculated by dividing the number of students who return to class after visiting the clinic by the total number of clinic visits during the school year. It offers valuable insight into how effectively school health services support attendance and reduce learning disruptions.
