



Baby Rxpress Program

The Florida Department of Health's Baby Rxpress Program provides six weeks of antiretroviral treatment (ART) to infants born to women living with HIV. This is accomplished through a voucher system with participating pharmacies throughout the state. When families have no other means to pay for the medication, the voucher allows them to receive it at no cost. The goal of the program is to ensure that every family leaves the hospital with the infant's ART in hand.

Under the program, a physician writes a prescription for the appropriate medication. The prescription, along with the Baby Rxpress voucher, is presented to a participating pharmacy, which then dispenses the medication. The pharmacy bills the Department for the cost of the medication, and payment is issued accordingly.

The Department continues to expand the program by adding new pharmacy partners. Currently, more than 80 participating pharmacies across the state are enrolled in Baby Rxpress Program.
